


Pollution prevention - wastewater



- #1 polluter of surface water in Canada
- Metro Vancouver
 - Only 50% treated to secondary level only
 - Annacis
 - Langley
 - LuLu
 - Lions Gate and Iona currently primary





Important local fish habitat

- Burrard Inlet:
 - over a 100 species of invertebrates, 70 species of fish, & many species of birds.
- Seymour and Capilano Rivers
 - significant salmon populations, including Coho,
 Chinook and Chum, and steelhead trout.




Secondary treatment (1914) Bugs consume the organics
